Minutes Review

The minutes from the February 23, 2021 were reviewed.

After meeting concluded Kirsti C. realized an error in the minutes being the date of February 23, 2022 in the minutes review should have been June 23, 2020 and corrected the error.

Parks Committee Seats

Kirsti C. discussed the seats that were currently vacant, those that have been appointed and those positions that there have been applications received for.

- Irrigon Park District current appointee is Glenn Maret.
- Willow Creek Park District appointee remains Kim Cutsforth pending minutes from their board.
- Morrow County Public Works representative remains Greg Close.
- Umatilla National Forest – Representative from Heppner Ranger District remains Doug McKay.
- Park User Group – Equestrian – one application received from Dean Robinson
- Park User Group – Motorized Recreation – one application received from Mike Gorman
- Park User Group – Hunting/Camping – one application received from Kirsti Cason

Kirsti C. explained that with applications being received for the positions now need a motion to confirm who represents each vacant seat.

Don R. – Questioned if there was only one applicant for each vacant position.

Kirsti C. – Confirmed that there was only one application received for each position that is vacant.

Parks Information & Requests

Kirsti C. – the number one request remains upgrades of electrical hook ups. Reservation numbers remain the same as last year give or take a few but the park have remained busy all year with the busiest being the OHV Park. The parks department will be applying for an Oregon State Parks and Recreation All-Terrain Vehicle Grant for the Operations and Maintenance of the OHV park. This grant is due in October and we are seeking letters of support for this project. This grant will be for the 2023-2025 biennium and is the main funding source that covers the expenses for the labor/employees and their overheads, upkeep and maintenance on the equipment, trails and infrastructure at the park. This year it is our hope to add another full-time employee.

Don R. – Questioned if there was any funding available for acquisitions of adjacent lands to the park.

Kirsti C. – Talked with state parks and they like a 1 – 2 year lead time for land acquisitions and when explained what property were looking at felt that it was to steep of a price for the land, but felt it was because of the structures on the land.

Greg C. – Added that the adjacent property has already sold and indicated that also talked with state parks receiving the same information that Kirsti mentioned.

2023 Tentative Calendar of Events

Kirsti C. – Referred to the hand out of events included with the packets, noting key dates and events at the parks.

Anson Wright Park – Updates/Projects/Grants

Greg C. – Explained that had new hosts at the Park this year with Ron Ford and his wife Gloria and that they had to depart early due to life situations. Elizabeth (Liz) Morris was willing to return to the park and is hoping to be host again next year as she misses the park.

Purchased and installed a Starlink internet system and seems to be working really well, no comparison to previous providers with the land line or HughesNet.

Sandblasted, applied three-part epoxy and then painted the playground equipment.

Campfires were shut off during the summer and were just permitted again a couple of weeks ago.

Cutsforth Park – Updates/Projects/Grants

Greg C. – Explained that Sandy McDonald returned again this year as host, but has indicated that this will be her last year. So will be needing to fill this position in the future.

Purchased and installed a Starlink internet system and like Anson Wright seems to be working really well, no comparison to previous providers on speed with download or upload times.

Sandblasted, applied three-part epoxy and then painted the playground equipment.

Campfires were shut off during the summer and were just permitted again a couple of weeks ago.

OSU 4-H program found a grant and was able to purchase a new hot water tank for the 4-H building and had it installed.

Hope to work with everyone in the coming year and replace the main power line that feeds the park, but will take some coordination to do so as the park will need to be closed and off limits while this takes place.

This past winter removed over 50 trees of various size due to being hazards, or potential blow down trees.

There was one near miss this past year where a tree blew down and just missed the camper's trailer and equipment. Will likely be removing more trees in the future.

Sheryll B. - Sheryl B. provided update on the Blue Mountain Century Scenic Bikeway ride (BMCSB) –

Numbers were down but all enjoyed the event. Requested maybe at the next event have a coffee or warming station of some type at Cutsforth.

Eric I. – Explained that there would be a chip seal project on Willow Creek Road in future, and was hoping to get dates for the next Bike event in hopes to schedule around the event.

Discussions continued about chip seal and the bike event. 2023 (BMCSB) will be 3rd week in September.

OHV Park – Updates/Projects/Grants

Greg C. – New park hosts this year Kathy Dill-Spears and Don Aschoff was a rough start being new but they came around and hope to be back next year if possible.

The Landing is doing really well and continues to be something that park and travels enjoy.

Opening weekend in May Northwest Trail Riders Association (NWTRA) hosted an event that brought in 275 riders to a really wet trail system. But riders seemed to enjoy and bared the weather. Then there were the motorcycle races that again brought new faces and experiences to the park.

The trails due to the weather and users took some time to repair but Geotech fabric, gravel, sawdust and culverts were installed to help with future drainage issues.

Requesting letters of support for the up and coming All-Terrain Vehicle (ATV) Operations and Maintenance Grant program for the 2023 – 2025 fiscal years. This grant along with camping fee revenues is what keeps the OHV Park operating and open to the public. It funds Full, part time and seasonal workers, youth summer crews, maintenance and up keep of structures, equipment and the trails system. Please spread the word and submit letters to the Parks Department Office in Lexington.

Public Comment

Greg C. – Asked all in attendance if there was an item in question about the parks not answered, if there was any recommendations to do things differently, or if there was any projects that should look into for the parks.

Mike G. – Wanted to know if the Parks Committee was going to get back to its spring and fall meetings with providing more notification warning prior to meetings.

Greg C. – yes that is our goal, asked Mike G. if he would you like to be the chair for the committee.

Motion for Mike Gorman to be Parks Committee Chair: Don R. Seconded by: Greg C. Approved with no objections

Glenn M. – Discussed happenings at the Irrigon Park District with the gazebo being rebuilt, security cameras installed and issues facing with grant funding. Having issues with approach access to the park and then also reviews for the moorage docks taking longer than expected so funding may be lost from grant resources. Hired someone help with the aquatic noxious weeds in the area. Several youth programs such as volleyball, football and basketball starting and taking off. The pickle ball court and dog park are in the works as well as upgrading outdated playground systems.

Rebecca H. – Boardman Parks District is in a phase of restructure and rebuilding and working with the city to get it done. The Oregon community grant has shown to be a successful program with about 50 kids attending through out the summer and many continuing still. There is an adult Volleyball program that started out with just one team but Tillamook put out a challenge and there are now eleven teams. There are some youth and adult self-defense classes scheduled. Will be updating the fall protection surface around the playgrounds as resources permit. A grant was secured for the Recreation Center for resurfacing the pool deck. Currently working on setting missions and goals for the future. There are also several activities on the calendar and encouraged everyone to come check them out.

Eric I. – questioned if there was something that could be done or discussed regarding all-terrain vehicle (ATV) use on Sunflower Flat road so users could travel from Anson Wright Park to the OHV Park.

Discussions regarding the ATV use on roads.

After short discussions it was determined that would need to be an ordinance from Board of Commissioners to allow ATV use on roadways.
