The Morrow County Sheriff's Office Communications Center operates 24 hours a day, everyday. The Center is staffed by eight Communications Deputies, Communications Sgt. Sarah Baker, and led by the Communications Lieutenant, Kristen Bowles, who is directly supervised by Sheriff Matlack.

These dispatchers work all shifts and holidays, just as our patrol deputies and are a critical partner in the safety and security of our citizens. They are the first voice you hear when you call for help, and they are quick, efficent and professional. They provide 9-1-1 dispatch services for sheriff, police, fire and medical emergencies.

Serving a 2019 population of 11,603, they answered 5,819 - 911 calls and 56,634 admistrative calls, making 24,748 call for service

MCSO Search & Rescue

December 18, 2019 at 5:11pm 85-year-old Jose Fernandez from Irrigon with advanced Dementia and Alzheimers was reported missing.

MCSO's Det. Scott Carter coordinated a seach of the area from about 5:30pm-6:30am with 39 search members from surrounding agencies, family and community members. Every farm, residence and outbuilding in the area, needed to be checked. It was a dark winter night, with cold freezing rain.

While the seach in Irrigon was occurring, the MCSO Communication Center in Heppner, was a beehive of activity, hoping to find an available aircraft or drone to help. They were also fielding many calls from concerned community members as well as the normal calls that come on an everyday basis, including other 9-1-1 calls.

December 19th about 6:30am Det. Brian Snyder took over as Incident Commander, issued search assignments and briefed 55 search members, all wanting to help bring Mr. Fernandez home.

Food was provided (and very much appreciated) for the searchers by Michelle Luna and Java Junkies.



At 11:41am on December 19th, Lt. Terry Harper and Undersheriff John Bowles found the missing man, Jose Fernandez, alive. He was transported to the hospital to be treated for exposure, and was expected to have a full recovery.

Morrow County Sheriff's Office would like to thank Irrigon Ambulance, Irrigon Fire, Oregon State Police, U.S. Fish & Wildlife, Umatilla County Sheriff's Office, Boardman Fire, Boardman Ambulance, Boardman Police, Umatilla Police Department and all the family and community members who helped out during the event.

Because we all worked together as a team, this man got to spend Christmas with his family, doesn't get any better than that.
