The transition has been a smooth one and working with H. Paul Gray has been a pleasure as we welcome him to the Emergency Manager position and to the Morrow County family."




MCSO Marine Program

Our Marine Program also completed **Five On-the-Water Rescues** during the 2021 Boating Season Great Job!



Also, four of our dispatchers welcomed new babies into their families in 2021.



Normally the training is over a sixteen-week timeframe, but due to COVID delays the training for this trio was twenty-weeks.


I'm sure it will go down in our history as one of the most unusal experiences at the Police Academy.

Communication Deputy Michelle Vaughn.


Michelle will train here in-house before heading off to the Academy for three weeks of Communications Deputy Training and then one week of Emergency Medical Dispatch Training.

Morrow County Schools Security Summit

Morrow County Sheriff's Office sent nine of our staff members, to participate in a training put on by Intermountain Education Service District (ESD). We have participated with the schools on many other trainings and safety remains a primary focus for school leaders and law enforcement throughout Morrow County.

On August 8, 2022

Morrow County agencies participated in a regional School Security Summit hosted by the Intermountain ESD in Pendleton. It was well attended by over 200 staff, from many different agencies all coordinating to help ensure the safety of our children. School administrators from Morrow and Ione school districts, along with representatives from Morrow County Sheriff's Office and Boardman Police Department, all participated in a review of the regionally adopted school safety protocols from the "I Love u Guys" Foundation. Other pertinent groups were involved as well, like fire departments, counselors and the bus transportation company. All in attendance are instrumental in the process and provided their own valuable perspective to the Security Summit.
