of the First Responder Team.



History bites from Oregon Sheriffs'...

Joseph Lafayette Meek

was Oregon's first elected sheriff.

He was born in Washington County, Virginia on February 7th, 1810.

He came to Oregon in 1840 and was elected sheriff in 1843.

He was re-elected in 1845.

Meek enforced liquor laws, and he was the first tax collector. Failure to pay had a penalty of losing voting rights, and others could jump your property claim.

Telly wants you to know . . .

Things you can do to prevent the unthinkable

Any parent or caregiver, even a very loving and attentive one, can forget a child is in the back seat.

Being especially busy or distracted or having a change from the usual routine increases the risk.

Here are some safety reminders from the American Academy of Pediatrics:

- Always check the back seat and make sure all children are out of the car before locking it and walking away.
- Be extra alert when there is a change in your routine, like when someone else is driving your child or you take a different route to work or child care.
- Have your child care provider call if your child is more than 10 minutes late.
- Put your cell phone, bag, or purse in the back seat, so you check the back seat when you arrive.
- If someone else is driving your child, always check to make sure he has arrived safely.
- Many hot car deaths have occurred when a child mistakenly locks himself inside.
- Make sure children do not have easy access to your car keys. Store them out of a child's reach.

Take action if you see a child or pet alone in a hot car

If you see an unattended child or pet in a hot car you should immediately call 911 and stay until help arrives.


May Day Celebration – Town of Lexington – May 6th






