

CERTIFIED RECORD OF LAND CORNER MONUMENTATION

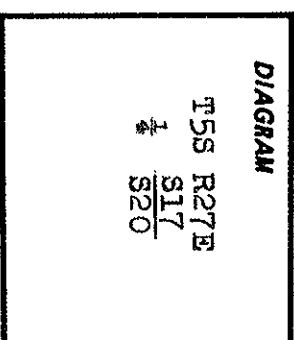

History of original corner establishment:

Edward W. Sanderson, under G.L.O. contract number 417, dated Aug. 24, 1881, set a sandstone 15"X 7"X 5" ten inches in the ground. Stone marked $\frac{1}{4}$ " on north face.

From the corner:

A Pine, 15" dia., North, 11 lks.
A Pine, 10" dia., S200E, 20 lks.



Description of corner evidence found:

From the corner point located at record distance from the original BTs:

A Ponderosa Pine, 16" dia., S7 3/4°E, 13.2 ft. marked: $\frac{1}{8}$ " BT on opened double blazes.
A Ponderosa Pine stub now approx. 12" dia. and 5 ft. high bears N48 $\frac{1}{2}$ °E, 7.3 ft.
This BT has faint scribbling on badly weathered double blazes that face the corner point.

I did not find the original corner stone.

Description of monument and accessories I established to perpetuate the original location of this corner:

At the original corner point I set a 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ "X 30" alum. pipe with a 3" alum. cap containing a magnet and marked:

S20
PLS 1832
1986

I built a stone mound around the monument.

From the corner:

A White Fir, 10" dia., N35 $\frac{1}{2}$ °E, 39.8 ft. marked: $\frac{1}{4}$ " S17 BT
A Ponderosa Pine, 25" dia., S50°E, 46.0 ft. marked: $\frac{1}{4}$ " S20 BT

BTs have blaze and a 6" stripe painted red, a BT tag, and an "Attention" sign. New BTs have, additionally, an alum. "PLS 1832" washer nailed to the bottom of the blaze. There is a 6' steel fence post with an "Attention" sign within 5' of the corner.

Measured to center of BTs using steel tape and staff compass. Magnetic declination set at 19°E.

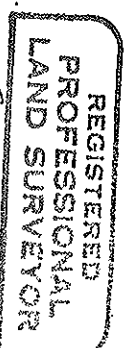
